Overview Metal Framing

This course will review the IBC 2003 and the IBC 2006 building code requirements for cold-formed steel framing members. It provides an in-depth analysis of the ASTM standards governing the four major components that nonstructural and structural steel framing members must meet to be code compliant. The course also addresses life safety issues when using non-code compliant material in fire-rated partitions.

Michael C. Kerner received a BS Degree in Architecture from Ohio State University. He previously worked as a Technical Services Manager for Marino/Ware Industries, a major manufacturer of building products, for more than 20 years.

Mr. Kerner has an extensive background in Codes and Standards. He is currently the Vice Chairman of ASTM Committee A05 on Metallic-Coated Iron and Steel Products, and the Chairman of ASTM Committee C11 on Gypsum and Related Building Materials and Systems. He is an ASTM Award of Merit recipient and a fellow in ASTM.
